Clouds on the Horizon



uccession planning is not strong within Friends groups. What will happen next, is rarely given thought. Most groups are busy arranging the next activity, meeting, booksale, campaign. Simply put – 'just surviving'.

The recent closure to one of our most successful groups in the country – Friends of Kew Library in Victoria, after some 20 years of stirling commitment and service to the library community, begs the question. How do we keep going? How do we survive?

Most FOL groups are by nature, individuals who have time to donate to the library, voluntarily giving many hours of committed service. When those individuals can no longer, physically commit this time, groups often struggle – rarely do we have a 'succession plan'. Business, industry, trade unions, and libraries face this reality – a disappearing 'corporate culture of experience', perhaps one of the most valuable assets to an organisation, including Friends groups.

Very often, well-established Friends groups have difficulty in recruiting new members because they are perceived by the community as a closed organisation – in other words that the officers are always the same and the programs and book sales are always the same. You can say you are interested in new membership or you can show that you are by handing the reins over to someone new to try something new.

One of the most important ingredients for membership is promotion, opportunity for participation, and follow-through. Your goal should be to ensure that every single person in your library community knows that there is an effort underway to increase support to the library

through Friends membership. Every member in your community should be invited to join and once they do, they should hear back from your organisation right away thanking them for their support. Some good examples of this 'PR' can be found at Great Lakes and Balmain in New South Wales and West Gippsland in Victoria. In other words – the 'PR' machine is well-oiled.



Perhaps the most effective mechanism for succession planning is to see the establishment and growth of junior Friends. Our past-president, Peter McInnes has stated — it would be my

wish to see every library in Australia having a Friends group, but also, that many should support the establishment of a junior Friends group.

The continuing efforts of librarians such as Libby Koeschet at Alexandra in Victoria is but one direction. Supporting the establishment of successive children to take an active role in library affairs can only enhance our long term survival. Have a talk to your library manager and children's librarian about initiating a group for young people. Ask yourself — why does our library not have a Junior Friends of the Library group?

he Committee of the Friends of the National Library of Australia have been considering methods that could increase the Friends membership and encourage a broader age group to get involved in the Library's Activities. With this in mind, two members of the Friends committee and two members of Library staff met with twelve young people from the public service graduate intake program to talk about their perceptions of the National Library, the Friends of the NLA and what, if anything, would encourage them to join the program. After two hours of lively discussion, the main outcomes were:

- All knew of the NLA and had a respect and admiration for it
- All knew its purpose
- Some had used the NLA frequently for study, and appreciated the availability of up-todate books and the peace
- Others used only the café and bookshop
- Others never came in, but admired the building as they walked past
- Almost no-one knew about the Friends of the NLA

By the end of the meeting, after National Library staff had shared some of the joys of the library and extolled the benefits of the Friends of the NLA, several people joined, and all offered good ideas for expanded Friends activities. A subcommittee of the Friends will continue to work on this topic and report back in future newsletters.

All Friends groups should undertake a study in the local area similar to the above. The strategy could take the form of:

- Two members of the Friends committee and two members of the library undertake the project
- Survey the public who use your library and survey a local secondary school at senior level

 If you have time and resources, also survey those who do not enter your library, for example, take the survey to the local senior citizens club or community group

The outcomes may surprise you. FOLA will publish any findings in *NewsUpdate*.
